Summary: A bill approving the changes to the Internal Rules of Procedure of the Graduate Student Assembly

13		the Vice President, a Chair shall be chosen upon the recommendation of the President and the approval of

The order of business shall reflect the best use of the time of its members and may be amended by a regular motion and majority vote."; and,
